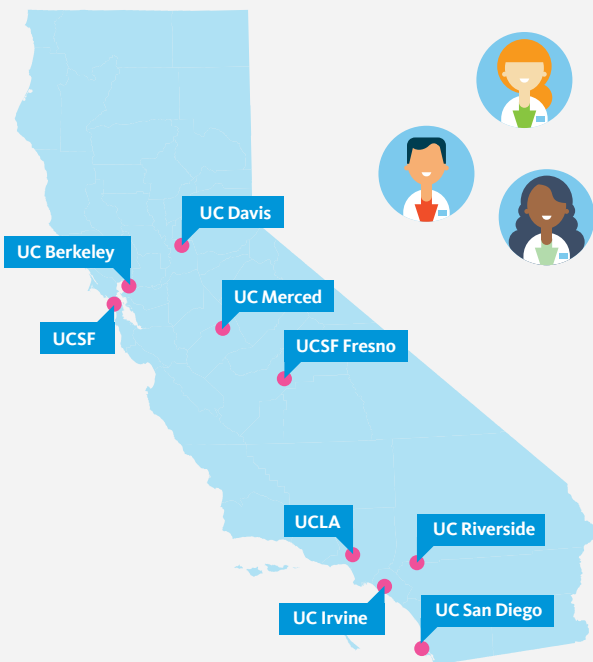


University of California's health system is committed to protecting and improving the health of all people across California, serving as a model for the nation and the world. Work toward this vision happens across the state by

UC academic health centers offer primary care for patients while also caring for those with the most complex cases – like those in need of trauma, burn, and transplant care. UC Davis Health, UCI Health, UCLA Health, UC San Diego Health and UCSF Health own and operate hospitals. UCR Health provides clinical care through community facilities, along with owned and operated clinics.

UC owns and operates FQHCs at UCI Health and UCSF Benioff Children's Hospital and provides services at other FQHCs throughout the state.

UC Health locations are the second largest provider of inpatient services to Medi-Cal enrollees in the state despite having only six percent of all hospital beds in California.

UC Health has one of the largest health professional instructional programs in the nation.

6 Schools of Medicine



Graduates earning an MD typically complete four years of medical school and three or more subsequent years in a residency program. Most go on to provide life-changing care or conduct innovative research.

2 Schools of Dentistry

1 School of Optometry



The Herbert Wertheim School of Optometry and Vision Science at UC Berkeley offers a doctor of optometry (OD) program, a doctor of philosophy (PhD) in vision science program, and a one-year residency program for ODs.

1 School of Veterinary Medicine



The UC Davis School of Veterinary Medicine offers programs for doctor of veterinary medicine (DVM), a dual DVM-Ph.D. through the Veterinary Scientist Training Program (VSTP), master of preventive veterinary medicine (MPVM), and graduate clinical residency and graduate academic MS and PhD degrees.

UC PRIME

UC Programs in Medical Education (PRIME) is an innovative training curriculum that equips students with supplemental education and trains them on how to deliver high-quality, culturally congruent care. Recognized as a successful model of health professional school education, UC PRIME recruits, trains and retains students from across the state who are committed to providing care in California's underserved communities.

UC Health continues to work to expand the successful PRIME model to other health professional schools across the system.
